#### Fibre Optic Broadband installation update, as understood by Margaret

On Tuesday evening 27<sup>th</sup> August, I attended a meeting in Warslow Village Hall, hosted by Connect Fibre ("CF"). The gist of the meeting was the Government has set a target date for every property in the country to access a fibre-optic internet connection by 2033 (hopefully prior to BT ending the copper network & removing our landline telephones) & has set aside funds to subsidise the cost of this. In November 2023 CF was awarded the contract for installing the fibre-optic infra structure in our area & I <u>believe</u> that Warslow is currently undergoing the installation work which should be up & running by next year.

Although we are part of the Warslow & Elkstone Parish Council area, the installations are not being done according to Parish Boundaries, but according to what telephone exchange you are currently connected to. Warslow is on the Buxton Exchange, Lower Elkstone is Onecote & Upper Elkstone is Leek, so each area will receive the installation at different times. The intention of CF is that talks will start with each area by November this year with a view to starting the work within a few months. The cable will run underground wherever possible, otherwise via poles. The general picture over the whole country is that if we wait another 9 years till the 2033 end date, we will get the roll-out eventually, but larger communities will get the roll-out first & the 'less significant' ones like us will be left till last. However, if we take advantage of the CF project, we should be next on the list in our area for getting a connection. Isolated properties which are off the beaten track will be subsidised or be part of a voucher system to help towards the costs. CF will be building the infra structure & installing the fibre-optic cable, but the infra structure system can then be used either to access their internet service package, or stay with your current provider who should be able to pay to access the infra structure.

I struggled to find any details on CF's website <u>www.connectfibre.co.uk</u> because I was reluctant to fill in my details to 'register an interest' (being afraid of committing myself to something I might not want!) but had more luck visiting the Government's own website <u>www.gov.uk</u> & searching for <u>BDUK North East Staffordshire</u> which explains things better than I can. It also provides a map of the coverage, but I could not make it big enough to be legible, so if anyone else can see the map & reproduce it for me so that we can see which properties are covered by which scheme, I would be grateful! A member of Connect Fibre's personnel at the meeting told me that Elkstones is Lot 19 in the North East Staffs Award, and that Lower Elkstone is AC3 and Upper Elkstone is AC6.
